This attitude allows us to do more than simply think outside the box, we actually <u>act</u> outside the box. There is so much joy, optimism and courage in this congregation that allows us to follow the Spirit of Christ boldly.

My wish for all of you, long-time members and newcomers, is that you will find WPUC a place where you find your soul nourished and your heart enlarged to serve the whole Creation. Enjoy the exciting news that follows!

- submit to a Criminal Record Check and Child Abuse Registry
- maintain the babyfold space in cooperation with the other groups that use the same space (Youth Group and Sunday School).
- be available for two hours on Sunday mornings between 10am and 12pm
- be available to start in September 2012

*Please note: the CDC is open to having two qualified individuals share the position.

Some of the upcoming services include:



Refugee Settlement Committee

Many of you will be aware that our church has volunteered to sponsor another refugee family. We are pleased to announce that our new family arrived in Winnipeg on July 17th, very tired after many hours of travel, but happy to be in Canada.

The family consists of the mother whose name is Hanifa, along with her four children including her nine year old son (Idrees), seven year old twin girls (Faiza & Rahila) and a five year old son whose name is Yahya. They are originally from Afghanistan, but had been living in Pakistan.

Since their arrival in Winnipeg, Hanifa has been consumed with the many things she has to learn in order to function in Canada. The task of finding a suitable apartment has proven to be very daunting and at the time of this writing, she had yet to be accepted for an apartment.

Many members of our congregation have asked us how they can help and offers have been made of a variety of items that will be needed when they move into an apartment of their own. They are most in need of clothing for **all seasons** as they came to Canada with very little.

Here is how you can help

We are soliciting donations of all types of clothing for Hanifa and her family. Our suggestions for clothing sizes are as follows:

> Hanifa—women's size large The oldest son—size 9/10 The twin girls—7 / 6X youngest son—size 5

In addition to clothing, they are in need of a stroller.

Manitoba Metis Federation Inc. Metis Community Liaison Department

Greetings, my name is Vicky Allard and I am the Metis Community Liaison Worker for the Winnipeg Region, which is one of seven Regional offices of the Manitoba Metis Federation (MMF). I have been employed with the MMF for nearly seven years.

The Metis Community Liaison Department (MCLD) was established to provide advocacy and voluntary support services to the Metis Children and Families across Manitoba. Program areas include: client & family support, referral & advocacy, reunification, elder support & repatriation. MCLD also assists with the Bereavement Fund and Elder's Firewood Program.

The Little Moccasins Healthy Baby Program is for both pre and post natal moms with babies up to one year of age. This program is facilitated by MCLD as we also provide programming. In the Windsor Park area of Winnipeg, this program is delivered, however it is open to any and all participants who fit the criteria. In addition, the Little Metis Sing with Me program, an initiative of Louis Riel Institute, has also been incorporated into the Little Moccasins program. As the facilitator, I meet with the Little Moccasins Team, which consists of a Public Health Nurse and Public Health Dietician quarterly to plan upcoming sessions that will be of both interest and necessity to the participants.

I am available in the Winnipeg Regional Office, Monday to Wednesday and Fridays, from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm. Thursdays I am available from 9:30 am to 11:00 am at the Home Office, and then off to facilitate Little Moccasins for the remainder of the day.
