
Worship Council

Finance and Stewardship

I hope everybody had a great summer and took the opportunity to attend services at Prince of Peace.

The Finance and Stewardship Committee continued on with its duties through the summer months. We would like to thank all those on PAR who helped us meet our obligations. It makes the task of counting that much easier.

We could use at least one more pair of counters starting in September. If you don't have a partner, we will assist in finding one. Peter has simplified and documented the



counting process so now it takes even less time than before.

As of July 31st, we have a small deficit of \$2,205.23. This is normal in the summer and is less than the deficit we thought we would have at this time.

Our total income, so far, is \$109,261.75 which is \$6,449.91 less than we budgeted and \$11,684.59 lower than this time last year. There are two major factors for the small deficit; we still haven't hired the second staff person, and collections by

envelope and PAR are below budget. We did receive at least one significant donation last



year that has to date not been repeated this year.

Kathryn Hofley, the United Church Planned Giving Coordinator, has been invited to WPUC on October 11, at 7PM. She is presenting a legacy-giving information session. More details will be published at a later time.

Please remember, donations received by December 31 will get a 2011 Tax Receipt.

Safeway cards will be offered again this Fall starting on September 25th. This is a major fund raiser for WPUC.

The Finance Committee has teamed up with Dorothy Talman to bring the awardwinning, highly acclaimed play, Padre X, to WPUC on Nov 10.

This play of "remembrance" is based on the true story behind Reverend John Weir Foote, a Presbyterian minister, who served as a padre to the Royal Hamilton Light Infantry. John persuaded his commanding officer to allow him to join in the 1942 Dieppe Raid and serve as a stretcher bearer.

As the battle drew to a close, the wounded tried to convince this padre to escape with them by boat back to the safety of England. John chose to stay with the wounded and surrendered to the Germans.

He spent the remaining three years of the war in various prisoner-of-war camps, where the challenges ministering to his fellow soldiers, were far greater than on the beaches of Dieppe. For his valour and courage, John Foote was awarded the Victoria Cross.

Tickets will be \$10 and be sold at the same time as the Safeway cards. Net proceeds will go to the Lift Fund.

The balance remaining on our Barrier Free Project loan as of July 31 is \$70,147.38. The WPUC congregation has contributed \$15,116.62 to the loan repayment so far this year.

After displaying tremendous heroism on the fire-soaked beaches of Dieppe, Foote stayed behind and spent three years as a POW so he could continue to minister to the men in his care. This is our opportunity to bring you up to date with some of the things that are happening with your Outreach Council.

The focus of much of our attention over the past few months has been West Broadway Community Ministry.

This summer, we prepared and served two lunches per month to the guests at West Broadway. Each time, we fed about 100 residents from the West Broadway area.

A special thank you to Diena Rodd, Gwen Polak and Evelyn Day who have coordinated the volunteers and food for these lunches. Thank you also to our volunteers who are critical to the success

of our efforts at West Broadway and a special mention for those who have baked cookies. Our guests at



West Broadway find it an especially great treat to be served homemade cookies.

Bob Gilbert expresses his thanks for our periodic collection of food items for the regular lunch program, as well as to restock their emergency food pantry. We are assigned food items to be collected for West Broadway every second month. Please watch for details in our Sunday church bulletins.

The Outreach Council has obtained approval from the official board of WPUC to start the process for sponsorship of a new refugee family.

However, prior to continuing with the approval process, we feel it is necessary to recruit at least three volunteers to be actively involved in helping the family through settlement issues. This would typically involve things like getting health cards, grocery shopping, setting up banking facilities and probably the most important task which is finding affordable housing. Anyone interested in taking on this challenge would not have to be a member of the Outreach Council, but we would provide direction and assistance as needed. Did you know that we collect the following?

Bread Bag Date Tabs – These are passed on to St. Martyrs and used in crafts to raise funds for wheelchairs in Third World Countries. Deposit in the corner drawer in the back of the Sanctuary.

Aluminum Pop Cans – (preferably squished flat.) These are passed on to the Shriners to help fund travel for sick children from the North. Deposit in the large bin in the kitchen.

Glasses - These are passed on to optometrists, then forwarded to Third world countries. Deposit in the corner drawer in the back of the Sanctuary.

Aluminum Pop Can Tabs – passed on to Holy Cross where they are redeemed for wheel chairs. Deposit in the corner drawer in the back of the Sanctuary.

Campbell Labels – Soups – Broths – Sauces – These are redeemed for items used in the church. Currently the choir has some needs. Deposit in the corner drawer in the back of the Sanctuary.

Used Postage Stamps – These are passed on to The Bible Society to provide funds for the purchase of Bibles. Remove the corner with stamps from the envelope. We also have a stamp collector who uses some of the stamps. Deposit in the corner drawer in the back of the Sanctuary.

Various people look after these projects, counting and delivering them. By setting any of these items aside and bringing them to church, you are benefitting others.
