Finance Council

At the time of this writing, our General Fund deficit is around \$29,200 despite the fact that PAR and Envelope are \$1,873 higher than last year at this time. If we manage expenses and our generous congregation follows the giving patterns of the past we are projecting a deficit of \$27,000. The deficit started in January of this year as givings were unexpectedly lower and never really recovered until Easter.

One theory is 'snow birds', our answer is 'PAR'. If you are planning to be in warmer climes this winter (lucky bird) please consider PAR or Pre-Arranged Remittance. PAR allows your budgeted monthly givings to WPUC to be transferred from your chequing account while you work on making par on the golf course. There are around 110 folks in the congregation who use PAR. It is easy; submit a voided cheque and the PAR form to Lucy at the Church office. You can make amendments at any time.

The Barrier Free Project repayments are below budget, we should have less than \$39,000 to repay by the start of 2013. M&S givings are \$19,448.70 as of October 31st.

Please remember only donations accepted by December 31, 2012 will be part of your 2012 tax receipt.

Councils should now be setting their 2013 budget. We are hoping that the budgeting/planning exercise will result in a 2013 budget that will embody our Mission Statement and empower the Councils to move forward with their plans. We will take into serious consideration our current givings levels. As in past years, we are selling Safeway gift cards as our painless fundraiser. We are also selling Poinsettia plants for \$20 each. Orders need to be placed by November 30 with the plants to be delivered on December 9. Signup sheets in the office or at the Safeway Gift Card purchase table.

We can always use a few more counters to assist with the Sunday offering. Training is available and the coffee is free. Look for the sign-up sheet in the foyer.

As with other Councils, we are also in need of new members. Please contact me if you wish to assist. In closing, I would like to thank you for your continued support of WPUC. I am constantly surprised and grateful for the gratitude you show towards the congregation.


We are into the season for Christmas Hampers.

Windsor Park United Church has volunteered to prepare and deliver 25 hampers on behalf of the Christmas Cheer Board and we need your help to be successful with this task. The hampers we prepare include a combination of non perishable food and perishable items such as turkeys, milk and vegetables plus some presents to help these 25 families have a Merry Christmas.

- 1. This year your Outreach Council has followed the pattern we started a few years ago in an effort to stretch the Christmas dollars as far as possible. For the past four or five months, members of the Outreach Council have been taking advantage of sale opportunities at all the grocery stores. Through the diligent work of some very careful shoppers, we are pleased to advise you that all of the non perishable food items have been purchased. The purchases to date have been paid from funds borrowed from our church. The perishable food items will be purchased on the day that the hampers are delivered which is December 22nd..
- 2. This is where we respectfully ask for your financial assistance to provide us with the funds to make the Christmas Hamper program a success. Enclosed with your copy of Southwinds is an envelope for Christmas Hamper donations. For a couple of Sundays, members of the Outreach Council will also be handing out "hamper donation" envelopes for those who receive their copy of Southwinds electronically. If you are inclined toward helping in this manner, please return your contribution in this envelope and drop it in the collection plate. Please ensure that your contribution for the hamper program is clearly marked for that purpose. The need for your monetary donations is even greater this year, as we are doing more hampers than last year. In addition, we have to repay the money we have borrowed from our church for the non perishable food, as well as provide for the purchase of perishable items.

(As an aside, for the past several years we have been delivering spring hampers to needy people in our area. We want you to be aware that the spring hamper program is funded from your surplus monetary donations collected during the Christmas season. This is definitely a gift that goes on giving.)

 As in past years, the Sunday School children will be provided with specific people from our hamper list to buy a gift for. These gifts can be brought to the church and presented on Sunday December 9th which is White Gift Sunday. We require driver volunteers to deliver the Christmas Hampers on Saturday, December 22nd. Check for the sign-up sheet in the Narthex at church.



5. We will once again have the Mitten Tree set up at the back of the sanctuary until the end of December. Anyone wishing to donate mitts, gloves, hats, socks, etc. please just hang them on the tree. These are donated to some schools in our area.

As you can see, we have some wonderful opportunities for you to help make a difference in the lives of people who are less fortunate than us. Every year at Christmas, this congregation amazes us with its generosity and we know this year will be no exception. On behalf of the needy families and children, thank you in advance, because we know your support will be terrific.

Our Afghan family of 5 have been living in Welcome Place on Bannatyne for over 3 months now. They were only supposed to be there for 21 days. This has proved to be a challenge for Hanifa as their apartment is extremely small. She has done very well keeping the 4 children occupied by taking them to the park and lately going to the main library where the children love the computer.

They will be moving into Ircom (a subsidized apartment on Isabel Street for refugees with disabilities) before November 20th. Apparently they are extremely lucky to have been accepted into Ircom which provides a lot of support and they will be allowed to live there for 3 years.

The children seem to love their school and are progressing nicely with their English. Rahilia is bussed to a different school (Lord Roberts) as it is wheelchair accessible. Everyday she is so excited to get to school she wakes up earlier than she has to asking Hanifa to go to school. She seems to be speaking more now and always has a big smile when she sees us.

The children were very excited for Halloween - a new experience for them. We had brought them some masks and a bag to collect their treats and their faces just lit up.

We would like to thank Margo Baldwin for taking the time to go to Welcome Place with Derek Read to show Hanifa how to cook a couple of meals in a crockpot she brought. They also took her shopping as she was having a bit of trouble figuring out what was healthy food and what was not.

Also, we would like to thank the congregation who donated clothing and household items and those of you who are storing items for us as we have run out of room.

We have delivered some of the warmer clothing as needed as there is no storage in their apartment. Hanifa and the children are always so grateful for everything we have taken to them.

After they move into their new apartment there will be more opportunity to help with family management, shopping, cooking, etc. At that time if there are other items needed we will request them in the Sunday bulletin.


