Johann Wolfgang von Goethe – 18th century German writer, politician.

Or think of Frank Baum's script of the Wizard of Oz.

The good witch Glinda tells Dorothy.

"Close your eyes and tap your heels together three times and think to yourself: there's no place like home. There's no place like home."

To the people of God trapped in a humiliating exile filled with oppression and despair the prophet Micah offers a promise from God.

The promise is "home".

- A secure place in this world always.
- A place where God will always dwell.
- Home is Bethlehem.
 - Not the great metropolis of Jerusalem but a small town.
 - The one to lead God's people home is "a regular guy" not a star.

The journey we are on through advent, marked each week by our milestones, moves us closer and closer to our spiritual home -> to Bethlehem -> to Jesus.

All of this represents the story of salvation => the assurance that God exists, that has been and will always be among us – that we are loved, imperfect or not – that our lives meaning and a calling.

That we belong here – in this place – in the family of Christ => HOME.

Home and family is the key to Luke's telling of Mary's visit with her cousin Elizabeth – home , in a Judean village, in the womb of an ordinary, humble woman God's powerful story of salvation comes to life.

I've heard people slyly say things like "Look at the CEO's – Christmas and Easter only"
Look on the urban dictionary website and you'll find dozens of other expressions BUT you may miss what's really happening.

Coming home – going back to our roots, re-visiting old family traditions, rekindling a long-silenced feeling.

Maya Angelou quotes "The ache for home lives in all of us, the safe place where we can go as we are and not be questioned."

In our busy, often frantic, transient world, home may be more distant -> the yearning stronger.

The more one does and sees and feels, the more one is able to do, and the more genuine may be one's appreciation of fundamental things like home, and love, and understanding companionship. Amelia Earhart

- The promise of a place where we are always welcome and where we will always "belong".
