The large dirty mountain was transformed into neatly folded gifts to: West Broadway Youth Services, Resource Assistance for Youth (RAY), Rossbrook House, Anishnabe (Presbyterian mission), United Church Halfway Houses and the Andrews Family Centre. It is so satisfying to know that good clothing can go to appreciative families rather than to the landfill. Thanks to Kal Kneeshaw for hosting the summer coffee and conversation—which included yummy goodies

every week! Thanks to Hannah and Tom Grandy for working so hard to weed and landscape the Memorial Garden.
