We have renamed our Blue Christmas Service this year "A Christmas Break". This service will be held on Monday ,December 22nd at 7 pm and will feature music, candles, prayers and stories to comfort and encourage you.

Christmas Eve will be busy at WPUC. We will begin at 5 pm with a family friendly service featuring the music of the Joyful Noise and the Praise Team. At 7 pm we will host a traditional service of communion and music with the Worship Choir. At 11 pm we are offering a more contemporary and contemplative service of music, stories and candles featuring soloists.

Finance and Stewardship

We enter into the season of Advent with feelings of joy and hope and our current reality.

Our feeling of joy comes from the early repayment of our Lift Fund loan. We should be very proud of this accomplishment of this hurdled barrier. As mentioned before, any funds designated for the Lift Fund will now be directed to the Boiler Fund unless otherwise instructed.

On the surface we should have hope because our current deficit is better than our budgeted deficit. Upon further review we are in this fiscal position because of extra special gifts from extra special angels, congregational events and funerals.

If you take the time to review our budget you will notice that the combined costs of Property and M&P are greater than the revenue from Envelopes and PAR. The previous surpluses that covered previous years' deficits are now depleted. The next hurdle we face is maintaining the service level we value.

Bible Adventures

At the time of this writing .it looks like we have survived Halloween and the snow so far. It makes for writing this so much easier when the sun is still shining through the window on an early Saturday morning.

Many of us may still be dreaming of those dog days of summer, but we that teach and coordinate the Bible Adventures are busy preparing for the lessons.
