PATRICK'S POINTS TO PONDER

"Faith is about doing. You are how you act, not just how you believe." Mitch Albom, Have a Little Faith: a True Story.

We are now almost three months into a new season at the Church and everything seems to be humming along. There is a sense of energy in this place, a sense of renewal. This Fall we have almost 50 individuals signed up for Christian educational programs, and it seems as if that number could continue to grow. A new energy is present. We have allowed ourselves to continue to experiment with worship and what that means, and it has been invigorating. A new energy is alive. We are living and breathing as a community of faith.

One of the questions that came up this summer and has been brought to the Executive for all of us to ponder is the question of "Why?" Why are we here? Why do we meet? Why do we have this thing we call church? If we can begin to examine these questions, as well as many others, we can work towards an even deeper understanding of what it means to be Christian in today's church and today's world. These are not always easy questions and, if we are honest, there is no easy answer. I think that it is in asking these questions and entering into open dialogue with each other that we come to learn more about what we each believe.



From this deeper understanding we might just be better able to hear Christ's call in the world and from there we can act. As the opening quote states, our faith is a faith of action and we, as people of God, are being called to action. To know what form that action might take, that is the tough part.

Since our last update in the spring, the O.C. has been keeping busy in support of West Broadway and the Winnipeg Christmas Cheer Board.

Each week, donations of food and hygiene items are picked up and delivered to West Broadway Community Ministry by Shirley and Gord Goossen. These items are used in their emergency food pantry.

During the summer months, four lunches were prepared and served to the guests at WBCM. This activity will continue throughout the coming year. Thanks to Derek Read for assuming the duties involved in organizing the lunches this fall. On the last Monday of each month, lunch will be prepared and served by WPUC volunteers to the guests of W.B.C.M. While the numbers vary, as many as 200 guests arrive. Your contributions of coffee and lunch supplies, as well as the home-baked goodies, go a long way to keeping food on their plates and smiles on their faces.

In September, some friends and members of Outreach participated in "Walk a Mile in my Shoes", a fundraiser/informational event in support of West Broadway Community Ministry. A lot of good work is happening in the community around WBCM and we encourage everyone who is interested to participate in this event next year.

For those of you who donated funds in memory of Lil Aird last winter, we are pleased to give you an update about the use of those funds. As Lil was a loyal supporter of WBCM, we felt all donations should be used for items that would support the work that is done year-round by that organization. A washer for the WBCM laundry room, two coffee urns for the dining/hospitality area, and \$150.00 worth of non-perishable grocery items (for the Emergency Food Pantry) have been purchased to date. Currently, a clothes dryer is being purchased. We have lately been asked to provide 45 pairs of warm socks that will be distributed as gifts to the WBCM guests during their Christmas supper. Sincere thanks to all who contributed in Lil's memory and to Lil, herself. WBCM is a busy place and the work that is done there has continued in part this year because of your ongoing support.

The Mitten Tree will be standing tall at the back of the church again, thanks to Lori Pattle. Hand-made or purchased mittens, gloves, scarves and tuques may be placed on the branches at any time during the month of December. After the holidays, the donated accessories will be delivered to children at an inner-city school.



Preparations are underway for the Christmas hampers. This year our goal is to prepare and deliver 20 hampers to families in the community. While the size of the hamper varies, the average cost is approximately \$100.00 (excluding gifts). We will again be partnering with the Sunday School to collect gifts for the children of the 20 families. (Thanks to Gloria Saindon who will be helping us get organized for White Gift Sunday on December 11^{th.}) We also want to thank Units 2 and 5 of the UCW for contributing items for the Moms, as well. We hope you will consider contributing to this worthy effort by purchasing a gift for one of the children, helping with hamper packing or delivery, or making a donation of money. Donation envelopes will be available with the church bulletins on November 27th and December 4th. A sign-up sheet for drivers (and trusty sidekicks) will be posted in the WPUC foyer. Hampers will be packed and delivered on Saturday, Dec. 17th.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank Bill McOuat for his participation on the Outreach Council for the past two years. Bill organized volunteers for monthly WBCM lunches, transported supplies, and served at the lunches himself. He has gotten to know the staff and many of the regular lunch guests there and they have, in turn, met a loyal supporter and advocate. In addition to his work with WBCM, Bill assisted with the preparations for Christmas Hamper deliveries last year. He contacted volunteer drivers, recruited help with packing, and communicated with the

20 families who were recipients of the hampers. His humour, clear-thinking, and patience made him an irreplaceable part of our team. We miss you, Bill. Take care!

A sincere word of thanks goes out to everyone who has supported Outreach activities during these past months. Many hands make light work!



It is Nov. 9th and we are still enjoying the geraniums, petunias and alyssum!


