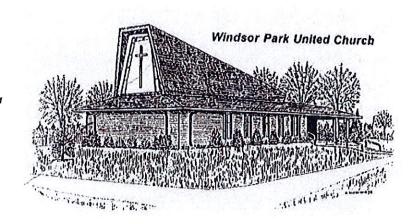

Another year has come and gone here at Windsor Park United Church and what a year it was. As we move into 2017 I am acutely aware of the fact that my time as a student is coming to an end and there will once more be some work to do around transition. I have learned a great deal from the people at Windsor Park United Church and I look forward to continuing together as we affirm and challenge each other along the way. What does it mean for us to be people of faith in the world today? Together we have explored this question and in the midst of these explorations I have come to understand some things about faith. It is okay to have questions and to actually ask these questions. We are a community that walks this road together exploring for each one of us what it means to be a member of this community. Like any family we don't always see things in the same way, but we continue to move forward together. I have learned this past year the life-giving nature of prayer. Both prayer within this community and my own personal prayer life have been enriched by being with you all. My own prayer life has given me the grounding that has allowed me to move through this past year, and, if I am honest with myself, a number of previous years. This community grounds me in my faith and when I am grounded I can reach out to God in the midst of the turmoil that is this thing that we call life. It is a blessing to be among you all.

Hope! Search! Follow! Believe! These were four of the themes that we explored during Advent 2016. I find it intriguing that these came to our attention as we ended a year of change at Windsor Park United Church. Yet, if I really think about it, these four can be seen as tenants of our faith. 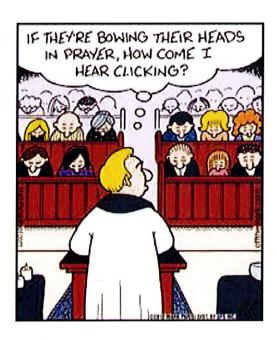

# Approval of the 2016 Budget

Doug Waldron presented the 2016 Budget. The line items of insurance and photocopier were moved from Property to Finance. The building insurance was reassessed from \$1.6 million to \$1.8 million.

Workers Compensation is paid for the office and custodial staff. CPP, El, and Group Insurance are paid for all employees. Pension is paid for all clergy and the administrative assistant.

A discussion ensued about the budget. The question of how to we deal with people who do not carry cash. It was noted the there were less givings on Christmas Eve. People are not carrying cash.

More people are using PAR (110), It was noted that 50% of givers are making up only 13% of the budget. We are loosing our long time givers. Approximately 30 givers have been lost this year.

Legacy gifts are not a part of our culture.

Reasons for the deficit include insurance and presbytery assessment. Presbytery back dates by three years and the losses we receive do not take effect until three years down the road. Savings from the new boiler will not be realized until July.

# CHRISTIAN DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL

The Christian Development Council is the council who oversees activities nurturing the faith journey of children, youth and adults. The Christian Development Council consists of: co-chairs Paulette Cote and Laura Steidl and council members: Patrick Woodbeck, Pat Lumsden, Heather Burnett and Melissa Horbas.

The Christian development council oversees the following areas: Bible Adventures, Library, Technology, Confirmation, Christian Vocation, Youth Group, Intergenerational Events, Tot Time, Baby Fold and Adult Education. Each area has a liaison who is contacting and developing a relationship with the people currently working in these areas and offering support where needed.

Highlights for 2015:

- CDC hosted a Quiz night on January 30 with 86 people coming out to join in the fun and raising \$867.50.

- We hosted a Thank You pancake breakfast for the Bible Adventures teachers and coordinating committee on May 3. Bible Adventures officially finished for the year on May 10, with 5 students hired to continue programming for children during May and June.
- A highlight for the year was our inter-generational bus trip to the Human Rights Museum on May 24. Over 45 people participated in this event, which included a 2-hour guided tour, and we thank Derick Hilliker for providing the bus, which really facilitated an opportunity for good discussion on the return ride to the church.
- Bible Adventures started again on September 17th with a full complement of teachers for children from Nursery to Grade 6 and many eager children. On October 18, we hosted a breakfast meeting for the teachers and the Bible Adventures coordinating committee. We are very grateful for their commitment to the children of the church! We would especially like to thank Gloria Saindon, who keeps things running smoothly from week to week, as well as the Bible Adventures Co-ordinating Committee. Classes are grouped by age and meet each Sunday, with the exception being Praise Team contemporary services and special events, when the children meet as a larger group. Bible Adventures also hosted a Sundae Sunday and created bulletin covers for the season of Lent.
- The church library is an ongoing project. Jan Shiaro is our current librarian and we thank her for her work in keeping this ministry going! We have begun to reorganize and cull the library so that out-of-date books can be replaced by current ones. An information video about our library was created and is currently on our website. Our presence on-line and on social media continues to grow.
- -The Youth Group/Intergenerational Corn Maze Event was a success with over 30 participants. The youth group has begun to meet regularly, approximately every 2-3 weeks with events such as games nights and movie nights.
- The Intergenerational congregational carolling event at St. Boniface Hospital on December 21 was very successful with approximately 30 enthusiastic participants. We would like to thank all the singers as well as the musicians, John Lwiwski (accordion), Nick Czehryn (guitar) and Heather Karavas (guitar).
- A Family New Year's Eve event was held for the first time on December 31 and was well-attended with approx. 25 people taking part.
- Two "meet and greet" events were held after church during coffee time. The first one was in February (Lent) and the second in December (Advent). There was positive feedback about the opportunity to chat with new people.
- Both Tot Time and Thursday morning study group started up for the fall season in October with good attendance. There continues to be a need for volunteers to help with Tot Time, especially during the winter months. The Thursday morning adult education group studied "What's So Amazing About Grace" during the fall months and was facilitated by Patrick. Sharon led the evening adult education group in the study "When Christians Get it Wrong."

The Christian Development Council also provided coffee after church during the month of November.

We are interested in having additional members join the team in supporting both our new minister and our congregation and we continue to learn and grow in faith!

Wednesday October the 12<sup>th</sup> we began the fall season with 14 moms, 7 children and 11 babies. With fewer children downstairs we have been able to transfer some of our caregivers upstairs to hold and cuddle the babies.

With many new Moms attending, several weeks were devoted to getting to know one another and planning for the year ahead. They took individual pictures of the moms with their children for the Tot Time Album and had fun making cards. A breakfast out at Alto's and a visit with Santa and Mrs. Clause was enjoyed by everyone. We ended the year with a potluck breakfast and the moms gave each caregiver a lovely tin of baking and a snowman with hot chocolate and marshmallows in it.

The loss of Lillian Aird in January 2016 was devastating to all of us at Tot Time. Lillian prepared a craft for the children for many years. She brought cookies on all of the special occasions. Sometimes the children even got to decorate them. The children were special to her just as she was special to them.

Some people left memorial gifts to Tot Time in Lillian's memory and we were able to purchase three new dolls and a little stroller. These are the first new toys that we have ever bought. The dolls we had were very well used and the children love the new ones. All of our toys have been given to us and we are very grateful to everyone who has donated them. We have a good variety of toys and books and the children enjoy their play time with them.

Lillian will forever be remembered and missed at Tot Time.

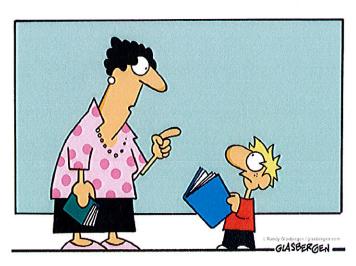

# OUTREACH

On behalf of the WPUC Outreach Council, I am pleased to provide the following update on our activities during 2016.

Throughout the year we provided supplies and people-power to support West Broadway Community Ministry. Shirley and Gord Goossen transported donations of grocery and hygiene items regularly to W.B.C.M. to keep their pantry stocked. Bill McOuat and Derek Read recruited volunteers to bake cookies, cook and serve meals and visit with the guests at W.B.C.M. each month.

In the spring, we provided funds for an Easter Hamper for one of the refugee families we had sponsored. We also supplied, prepared and served items for the meal served at the W.B.C.M. Volunteer Appreciation supper.

Last summer, we stretched our budget so that we could provide four meals to W.B.C.M. guests during the summer months when their outside support tends to decrease. We also began preparations for the Christmas Hamper project!

In September, a team of 10 volunteers participated in the 'WALK A MILE IN MY SHOES' fundraiser in support of W.B.C.M.

In December, our members were able to pack and deliver 20 hampers for families in the community with the direction of the Christmas Cheer Board. Besides perishable and non-perishable grocery items, we were able to include gifts for all members of those families. We gratefully acknowledge the generous support of the WPUC congregation for their donations of time, muscle, and financial resources. We also want to thank the Sunday School staff and children, the UCW units 2 and 5, and other friends in the congregation for helping us provide gifts for the families. A surplus of funds remains so we are planning to use this to prepare some Spring Hampers in 2017.

Donations of winter clothing that were placed on the Mitten Tree were gathered after Christmas and delivered by Laura Steidl to an inner-city school for distribution to children in need. We have also partnered with the congregation of Prince of Peace Lutheran Church to gather supplies of bedding, clothing, and hygiene items to make Winter Bags for homeless individuals in the St. Boniface area.

At this time, we would like to acknowledge the friends and family of Lillian Aird who made donations to Outreach in her memory when she passed away. As Lil was an enthusiastic supporter of W.B.C.M., we felt that the funds should be used to purchase items needed by that organization. To date, we have provided funding for a washer, two coffee urns, emergency pantry supplies, socks given to guests at the W.B.C.M. Christmas dinner, and a dryer. We miss Lil but are proud of the legacy she has left.

As we look back on the projects undertaken during the year, we are greatly encouraged by the efforts of our small, but hard-working council and by the

# **WINNIPEG PRESBYTERY - HIGHLIGHTS OF 2016**

February-Our General Meeting was held at The United Church in Meadowood with co-hosts of the meeting being Trinity United Church, Charleswood United Church, McClure United Church and Oak Table Community Ministry. We were very fortunate in having Rita Chahal, Executive Director, Manitoba Interfaith Immigration Council as a guest speaker. Rita highlighted the many services of the MIIC, who welcome and assist refugees in their settlement and integration into Canadian society.

March–The General Meeting was held at Windsor Park United Church with cohosts of the meeting being Transcona Memorial United Church, Grey Street United Church, Westminster United Church and Rainbow Ministry. In response to the priorities that Winnipeg Presbytery set at its meeting in the fall, Richard Manley-Tannis, the Presbytery Minister and Lesley Harrison from EDGE, were invited to present some resources available to congregations. Patrick Woodbeck reported on the initial meetings of the City-Wide Worship Service Organizing Committee which is being planned for April 23, 2017.

April –Our General Meeting was an all-day meeting that was held at St. Mary's Road United Church. The co-hosts of the meeting were Churchill Park United Church, Korean United Church and St. Matthew's-Maryland Community Ministry. Judy Bradley gave a presentation on Rock Lake United Church Camp and the recent renovations that had taken place. Table talk time was spent sharing what was happening in each person's place of worship –what is the gift, the highlight that keeps you going to church and to share what is a challenge. The meeting adjourned at 10:45 a.m. At 11:00 a.m. we had a brief workshop on Governance models. Following a pizza lunch, we had a workshop on the Remits, facilitated by the Winnipeg Presbytery GC Commissioners: Tim Crouch, Bill Millar and Patrick Woodbeck.

May-The May General Meeting was held at Broadway Disciples United Church with co-hosts of the meeting being Knox United Church, Young United Church, Chinese United Church, Augustine United Church and West Broadway Community Ministry. Remit 2: Elimination of Transfer & Settlement and Remit 3: Office of Vocation, were voted on by Winnipeg Presbytery and were approved. Winnipeg Presbytery thanked Patrick Woodbeck for his ministry as Rainbow Minister for the past six years. It was observed that he was dedicated to the church and had taken this ministry beyond Winnipeg Presbytery. Due to cuts to Mission & Service grants, regretfully the position of Rainbow Minister had been eliminated effective the end of June. The ongoing work of the five community ministries was also presented.

June –Our General Meeting was held at St. Andrew's River Heights United Church with co-hosts of the meeting being Atlantic-Garden City United Church, Sparling United Church, Kildonan United Church and Fred Douglas Lodge. Remit 1: Three Council Model was voted on by Winnipeg Presbytery and was approved. Sharon Wilson presented highlights from her trip to China as part of the United Church delegation that visited China in 2015. We also recognized the retirees –Terry Hidichuk, Barb Janes and Sharon Wilson.

September–The General Meeting was held at John Black Memorial United Church with co-hosts of the meeting being Immanuel United Church, Gordon King Memorial United Church, North Kildonan United Church and North End Stella Community Ministry. Remit 5: Ministry Partners with Mutual Recognition of Ministry Agreements, Remit 7: Candidacy Pathways and Remit 8: Towards a New Model of Membership, were voted on by Winnipeg Presbytery and were approved.

October–Our General Meeting was held at St. Mary's Road United Church with co-hosts of the meeting being Churchill Park United Church, Korean United Church and St. Matthew-Maryland Community Ministry. The 2017 Mission & Service (M&S) Fund Block Grant was approved. Richard Manley-Tannis, the Winnipeg Presbytery Minister, updated Presbytery on the initiatives he is working on. Lesley Harrison from EDGE, gave a presentation highlighting Embracing the Spirit.

November–The General Meeting was held at Windsor Park United Church with co-hosts Transcona Memorial United Church, Grey Street United Church and Westminster United Church. The court approved the 2017 Budget and referred the Congregational Assessments to the Executive to be finalized. Niigaan Sinclair, the invited guest speaker of the Presbytery Truth & Reconciliation Response Group, gave an informative presentation.

# UCW (United Church Women) and Financial Statement

The UCW is composed of Unit 2, Unit 5 that meet monthly here at the church in the afternoon and the YAH's who meet monthly at the church, but in the evening. In 2016 there were 54 active members.

In January, greeters, ushers, liturgists and communion servers were UCW members.

St. Martyrs-Canadiens Roman Catholic Church hosted World Day of Prayer in March. UCW members took part in the service written by the women of Cuba.

An Open Meeting was held in May. We presented Camp Quality Puppets (a community education program that teaches children about childhood cancer through the use of 4 life-sized puppets). Deb Scott was the speaker. An honourarium of \$150 was presented to the organization.

The Spring Rummage Sale was a go on May 27 & 28. The hard work of UCW and the congregation made it a success. Flavie-Laurent picked-up the unsold items. Leftover shoes were taken to Canadian Footwear to be recycled.

In June the UCW executive provided a cold lunch to 35 volunteers working on Habitat for Humanity build on Grover Street.

Coffee & Conversation was held Wednesday afternoons 2-4 pm during July and August.

Coffee after Worship in September was served by the UCW.

November 26 was the Cookie Walk. 8-10 dozen Christmas themed cookies were baked by each member as well as members of our congregation to make this a success.

Throughout the year UCW members take turns cleaning the church's 2 kitchens. Unit 2 and the YAH's provide a delicious home-cooked meal for the AOTS dinner meetings, six times during the year.

Please note that in 2016, the UCW purchased the new Frigidaire Professional double wall ovens, 10 new plastic tables and the cart to store them on, a 20 pan rack, pans and cover, 50 more coffee mugs, ice cream scoops, decaf lids for thermal jugs and 2 booster high-chairs. The UCW also forwarded \$1000 to the General Fund of the church.

# FINANCE & STEWARDSHIP

In 2015, WPUC experienced a \$12,790 deficit and in 2016 a \$19,308 deficit. This has been a continuing trend for several years even though we had a surplus of \$5,600 in 2014. Our projected deficit for 2016 had been \$30,000 but was \$11,000 less due mainly to a \$41,000 reduction in Ministry and Personnel costs as we transitioned from having both full time and half time ministers to one full time student minister.

We have seen fewer numbers of givers in the last several years along with an annual decrease in offerings received from Envelopes and PAR. It is our challenge to reverse these trends and return to and sustain a healthier financial situation.

In 2016 we focused on increasing the number of PAR givers and community fund raising events. We have about ten more members on PAR and this will help the cash flow situation during the summer months. We had a well-attended ``Country Blend`` concert and successfully introduced our ``Gifts Catalogue`` as a year round opportunity for donations.

During the past few years we have successfully achieved several large projects; a full kitchen renovation, the new lift installation, creation of new parking and access, a new boiler installation, establishment of WPUC as a United Church Learning Site and updating basement lighting and ceiling.

Our 2017 project is committing to a Stewardship campaign that will address offerings, fund raising and membership. We will continue our PAR drive and will again ask members to examine their offering objectively. We will look for new community fundraising events that welcome people from outside our congregation rather than only relying on our current membership. We also want to increase the number of functions and rentals using our church facilities. We will continue to celebrate the talents and gifts of our committees and volunteers with video presentations highlighting the many services and good works they provide. We will hold a Strategic Planning and Visioning session to map out the long term goals we will need to sustain WPUC as an important contributor to our community.

With all this in mind, we have cautiously projected a \$9,000 surplus for our 2017 budget. The Finance and Stewardship committee is not just about budget, income, expenses and spreadsheets, but has to deal with new membership, new ideas and innovations for our congregation. With the above mentioned comments in mind, we are seeking folks with abilities in human resources, social media, interpersonal skills, and creativity to lead the Stewardship aspect of the committee to assist in fulfilling the vision and sustainability of WPUC.
